

Cub Scout Pack 392: Frequently Asked Questions – Registration

How are the different age groups organized?

Entering 1st Grade - **Tiger Cubs:** Has one den leader with all parents participating at every meeting. Three meetings per month – two at school and one “Go See It” activity/meeting at a prearranged location.

Entering 2nd Grade - **Wolf:** Has one den leader, an assistant den leader and one rotating parent in charge of crafts and snacks per meeting. Two meetings a month.

Entering 3rd Grade - **Bear:** Has one den leader, an assistant den leader and one rotating parent in charge of crafts and snacks per meeting. Two meetings a month.

Entering 4th Grade - **Webelo I:** Has one den leader, an assistant den leader and one rotating parent in charge of crafts and snacks per meeting. Two to three meetings a month.

Entering 5th Grade - **Webelo II:** Has one den leader, an assistant den leader and one rotating parent in charge of crafts and snacks per meeting. Two to three meetings a month. In March, Webelo II's may then choose to move on to join Boy Scouts.

What does it cost? Your \$30 fee covers registration to next February and the activity fee to September. Please make your check payable to Pack 392.

The \$30 annual registration (March to February) with the Northwest Suburban District Cub Scout organization includes Boy's Life magazine, training for pack leadership and liability insurance.

The activity fee is \$225 of popcorn and wreath sales with 1/3 applied to the pack, 1/3 to cover the costs of Northwest Suburban Council Scout organization and remaining 1/3 to cover the cost of the wreaths and popcorn. If you sell over \$225 of wreaths and popcorn, 1/10 of your excess sales become Scout dollars that you can use the scout dollars to pay registration, camping and other costs. If you sell less than \$225, then you just will need to pay the \$75 activity fee to Pack 392. Your activity fee pays for all the scout's expenses to outings and the Blue and Gold Dinner in February.

What are outings? Camping, archery and bonfire in August, nature hikes, professional sports (the Flyers, Wolves, Solider Field, and Chicago Fire), Olympics, Pinewood Derby, Rocket Derby and many other events. One parent is expected to attend outings with their son but the whole family is invited.

What is pack night? When the entire pack (all five groups of boys and their parents) gets together at Aldrin's gym to go over the prior month's activities, receive awards and conduct pack business.

What camping opportunities are available? The Northwest Suburban Council has two camps, Lakota (just off Route 14 about 8 miles West of Woodstock, IL) and Napowan (40 miles West of Oshkosh, WI). Our pack camps and does a bonfire at Lakota in August. Family camping is offered on Memorial and Labor Days. Day camps are held throughout the summer in the Northwest Suburbs including the Schaumburg Nature Center. Go to <http://www.nwsc.org/camps/> to get more details.
